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Osceola County families invited to first Reading Fest

In partnership with many countywide initiatives, Osceola County saw a 20 percent year-over-year increase in students' readiness rate in 2016 based on kindergarten assessments. Currently in year two, Osceola Reads continues to help improve the literacy skills of Osceola County students. As of Nov. 10, 2017, Osceola Reads had registered 6,573 community users for the Footsteps2Brilliance app since the launch of the program in February 2016, in addition to every student in the district grades VPK through 2nd grade. Older students are able to register and use the app also.
